Everyone has their own story of why they came to New Light. Some people continue to worship here and some move on. Here is one story.

Every Sunday morning for more than two years I chatted online with Harold Gress, via gay.com. Each conversation usually involved me asking "So, what are you doing today?" His standard response was "Going to church. Would you like to go along?" My response was usually "no thank you ... some day."

I remember going to church with mom. The choice each Sunday was, "get ready for church or spend the morning doing chores for dad." I begrudgingly went to church. Church meant sitting in the pew, uncomfortable in my suit, and wandering if I was the only one that was hiding their true identity ... a gay boy who didn't know what that was yet.

I'd sit in church, sweating from the "hell and brimstone" that we usually got each week. Later, as ages broke down into classes for Sunday School I'd witness confessions of teenage sexual bragging and wondering if that was appropriate for church.

When I moved out of my parents' home I considered myself free from going to church. I still would get the occasional hint from my mom about going to church. She said she didn't care "where I went ... just so I went." I tried other friends' churches. Still sat thru the services wondering if anyone could tell I was "different." I felt I was being judged without anyone even saying a word.

Then the unthinkable thing happened ... dad passed and then mom passed 5 years later. Due to their advanced ages I had a routine of helping them go thru this part of life. It wasn't fun. But, I'm glad I was the kind of son that helped their parents.

Suddenly I had "no routine." I'd wake up on Sundays, launch gay.com, and chat with friends. I avoided the sexual exchanges and bothered my friends. That's when I started my "routine" with Harold. "So, what are you doing today?" "Going to church. Would you like to go along?" ... "no thank you ... some day."

One Sunday, searching for something to do ... and hungry ... I stopped by "Moe's Southwest" in Hager-stown. While ordering my "gaydar" went off and I turned around and there sat Harold with two other guys. They asked me to join them. I noticed they were wearing comfortable clothes, including shorts. I asked if Harold skipped church that day. He said no, in fact they just came from church. At that point I knew I had to check it out.

So, next Sunday, in comfortable clothes and shorts and sneakers, I met Harold in the parking lot at New Light MCC. I wasn't quite sure what to expect.

Going in, what do I see, but at least 8 people I have known from the bars in the past. Friends who never invited me to the church, who never told me they went to church. Only one did ... Harold ... although he didn't tell me it was a mostly gay attended church.

Sitting there I felt at home. No one judging me. I knew their stories and they knew mine. Sweet relief.

The pastor was a charming English man. Great delivery and stories. He introduced himself during the social hour. I asked him if it was okay to bring food from the bakery I worked at. You would have thought I was his new best friend. I told him who I came in with, Harold and his friend Chad. He said he "felt sorry for me" in his English wit.

The more I came to church, the more comfortable I felt being there. And, I felt I had a talent that could benefit the church. Something that I did for 26 years but recently, due to an off-shore buyout, had ended. Typesetting and printing. I asked the pastor if I could help him with the bulletins, freeing him to do visits, and work on his many projects and sermons. He finally felt comfortable "letting go."

As peoples' lives change, the pastor moved back to the UK. Sad. I was hired by the board to continue to do office work.

I still find an incredible peace coming to church here at New Light MCC. No matter who preaches, I still feel the inner peace that I'm amongst friends. I love hearing the stories from the Bible that I'm hearing in a more peaceful, relaxed delivery ... not the "hell and brimstone" of my youth. I love trying to figure out my own version of the parables of Jesus.

Some of my friends that I saw at New Light MCC that first day have moved on. Lives change. Still Harold is there. And, I no longer chat with him on gay.com ... it changed to Facebook. He continues to be someone who is helpful at the church as we move forward. It's his dedication, and others that inspire me to stay and help us with our next step as a congregation.
