Volunteer Thanks!


Thanks again to Rosalie Jones who has volunteered to take all our recyclables, paper, aluminum and plastic. If anyone wishes to help, please see Rosalie.

Sunday Service volunteers are always needed. Be sure to sign up each week or respond to the volunteer emails sent out each week. You don't need to be a member to volunteer and participate in the service. A few of the positions needed to help keep the service running smooth are:

Altar Angel: This person prepares the communion juice and wafers and makes sure the proper seasonal adornments are used on the altar and the pulpit.

Either make coffee for social hour or ask someone to make it.

Greeter: This person is responsible for making sure they have all the items needed to greet people coming into the church ... bulletins, visitor packets, special occasion handouts. They greet each person, hand them bulletins, etc. for the service, ask if they would like to assist with our service and sign people up. If the person is a visitor give them a visitor packet and mention there is a form inside for them to request more information about the church and to help us to get to know them better as well. While doing your duties try not to have your back towards new guests as they come in the door. Always be ready to give a greeting of welcome.

If there are members in the area at the same time a visitor comes in get them involved in greeting new people. Make them feel they found a home here. Don't go "overboard" and scare them.

Sound: This person works in conjunction with the pastor and the musician to make sure the levels needed for best sound are kept throughout the service.

Training is available.
